Cody Reunion in Florida November 14-17

Getting There By Plane

The closest large airport is in Orlando, about 50 miles from Lake Wales. Among the major airlines serving Orlando are the following: Air Canada, America West, American Airlines, Continental Airlines, Delta Airlines, Frontier Airlines, JetBlue, Midwest Express, Northwest Airlines, Southwest Airlines, United Airlines and U.S. Airways.

Major car rental companies at the airport include: Avis, Budget, Dollar, Alamo, Hertz, National, and Thrifty.

Getting There By Car

From Orlando - Take Interstate 4 west and then Highway 27 south.

From the far north - Take Interstate 75 south to Ocala where you can pick up Highway 441/27 south to Lake Wales. An option for those who like the high speed highway is to take I75 all the way to Tampa and then take I4 east to Highway 27 and turn south.

The Green Gables Inn is located on Highway 27 north of Lake Wales. It is a complete lakeside resort with a fitness and recreation center, a private beach and dock on a lake with excellent fishing, and a pool. From these contacts it is apparent to me that the interest in Buffalo Bill Cody is - Richard Grosenbaugh timeless.




You've seen their names on the masthead listing association officers. Now let's place a face with the name.

Sites to Visit

William Pinkney has provided this photo of the plaque in memory of Philip Cody and William F. Cody erected at the Dixie Union Chapel in Hamilton, Ontario. For Philip it reads: "Born Oxford, Mass. First settler Toronto Township, Lot 11, 1796. First Constable, Justice of Peace and entrepreneur. Donated this land Lot 10, N.D.S., 1810. In 1815, est, a trust which created this church and cemetery". Remembering Buffalo Bill it reads: "Baptized in this church 1847." The plaque was erected by the International Cody Family Association, the trustees of Dixie Union Chapel and the Government of Ontario. This is a site that should be on every family member's list of "must-sees."

Pinkney also reports that the house in which Philip lived from 1795 to 1822 in Mississauga, Ontario, is now the Cherry Hill House Restaurant.

News Briefs

Aldus Cody was married in Kissimmee, Florida on June 1 to Bertha Carnahan, a longtime family friend. Aldus' wife Dorothy died in February. The couple is now at home in a new apartment in Good Samaritan Village in Kissimmee. Aldus and Dorothy were both very active in the Cody Family Association.

Buffalo Bill leaped into the headlines again recently when a 124-year-old billboard promoting the Wild West Show was uncovered in Jamestown, N.Y. The 10 by 26 foot billboard was uncovered by workers removing the wall of a downtown building. According to the Associated Press report on the discovery the poster shows Buffalo Bill waving his hat to a crowd announcing: "Buffalo Bill in his new theatrical drama...May Cody" on March 14, 1878.

Deciphering your fifth/gen ID

If you've taken a look at the Cody Family Directory you'll notice each entry identified by a number in the format 000/000. Ever wonder what that is for?

The number relates each current Cody family member back to the genealogical information in Five Generations: The Cody Family in North America and their relationship to Philip Cody, the head of the family in North America.

For instance, my fif/gen identifer is 270/3421. It translates this way:

270 - Ansel Manley Cody (Fifth Generation)

- 3 Lewis Anson Cody (Third child of Ansel Manley)
 - 4 Frank Cody (Fourth child of Lewis Anson)
 - 2 Hazel Mae Cody (Second child of Frank)
 - 1 Richard Alan Grosenbaugh (First child of Hazel Mae)
