INTERNATIONAL REUNION MEETS IN CODY, WY, JUNE 28 -JULY 1, 2012

Every 10 years the Cody Family International Reunion traditionally gathers in Cody, WY, the town founded by William Fredrick Cody, aka Buffalo Bill, and the home of the Buffalo Bill Historical Center

Although it is not our customary time to meet, we are breaking with tradition for a very good reason. The Buffalo Bill Museum, one of the five museums of the Buffalo Bill Historical Center, and the one most closely associated with the Cody family, will be reopening June 29 after extensive renovations.

ICFA FORGES STRONGER BONDS WITH BUFFALO BILL MUSEUM AND BBHC

The ICFA board met with the Buffalo Bill Historical Center (BBHC) Executive Director, Bruce Eldredge, and Staff in June of this year to discuss how the ICFA can best interface with the BBHC for the benefit of both parties. After several discussions, the board agreed to share the ICFA mailing list (including email addresses) with the BBHC so that our members may be informed of future BBHC activities and events at the Buffalo Bill Museum. You will learn about the BBHC outreach programs throughout the nation and the world in which you may want to participate. Additionally, the BBHC has also offered to establish a kiosk in the Buffalo Bill wing that will make visitors aware of the ICFA and permit them to determine if they are related to the Cody family.

The ICFA and BBHC will NOT share ICFA member information with orga-

nizations other than the BBHC and the kiosk will not display any data that will reveal personal information about living persons.

The BBHC has offered to archive, conserve, preserve, insure and digitize Cody family letters, artifacts, and memorabilia in the names of Cody family donors.

The Board is confident that ICFA will benefit from greater exposure at a world-class museum and that will engender more

interest among Cody family members as they realize that the original Buffalo Bill Museum was founded by members of our family.

HOW TO GET TO CODY

Cody is located in the NW quadrant of Wyoming, just 52 miles from Yellowstone Park. It's at the intersection of: US Hwy 14, 16, 20 and WY 120. It is accessible by road or air.

By car: From East: thru Denver and Cheyenne. From West: thru Yellowstone. From South: thru Salt Lake City and Grand Tetons. From North: thru N. entrance of Yellowstone, Billings or Glacier National Park.

By Air (2 airports): Yellowstone Regional (COD), ~2 miles from town, or Billings (BIL), about 2 hours North. Most flights go through Salt Lake City or Denver. Both airports have cars available and they are usually a little cheaper in Billings. There is a shuttle between Billings and Cody (see www.codyshuttle.com for details). It may be cheaper and more convenient to fly into Billings and rent a car than flying into Cody. Check airline schedules and costs.

TIMES THEY ARE A'CHANGING - USE YOUR EMAIL

The ICFA is planning to improve our communications with its members via email notification of events, such as reunions and other time-sensitive activities of interest to the Cody family. We will continue to publish the REVIEW newsletter twice each year and email notifications will give us the opportunity to let you know of developments between newsletter publications.

INFO STILL NEEDED

The deadline for the upcoming genealogy and directory books has passed. While they will not appear in the new publications, please continue to submit updates to your family records. They will be included in our family database and will be available for future editions. Changes in address, phone and email are very important as they allow us to keep in touch with you through the REVIEW and occasional emails. Also, did you know that when we send our newsletter to an address that is not current, we have to pay first class postage when the newsletter is returned to us as undeliverable? Please think of the ICFA when you are sending out those changes of address notices - and send us an email if your email addresses change. We want to keep in touch with you. After all, you are family.

The purpose of the Directory is to provide current mailing and email addresses to encourage communication among family members. If for any reason you do not wish to have any part of your information in the Directory, you must let us know now. You can do so by sending an email to email@cody-family.org or leaving a message at (513) 871-8661. Provide your name, Cody Family ID (from the REVIEW address label), your address and purpose of email or call. The Genealogy does not contain personal contact information. If you opt out of the Directory listing you will continue to receive the REVIEW and email from the International Cody Family.

We also encourage you to use email to provide family information to our Genealogist (Barbara Metalsky: quest4lineages@aol.com) and articles for the REVIEW (Dorothy Rauh: editor@cody-family.org) or web site (Allan Cody: webmaster@cody-family.org). Family updates and additions may be sent to us by using the forms in the REVIEW. However, you are strongly encouraged to use email or our web site. These methods reduce misinterpretation, are quicker to handle and more accurate.

If you haven't provided your email address already, just send an email to email@cody-family.org with "email update" in the subject line. Put your name, address and Cody Family ID (from your REVIEW label) in the body of the email. Please consider including email addresses of your adult children so they can be included in our notices. You may also go to the ICFA website, mouseover "Membership," then click on the "Update Me" button and complete and send the form.

IN AND AROUND CODY

The main attraction in Cody is the Buffalo Bill Historical Center (www.bbhc. org), which houses five museums under one roof: Buffalo Bill Museum, the Whitney Gallery of Western Art, Cody Firearms Museum, Plains Indian Museum, and the Draper Museum of Natural History.

Other places to visit include Tecumseh's Old West Village, a wonderful display of miniature scenes tracing the history of Wyoming – a fascinating place. Old Trail Town and Opera House is composed of 26 famous historical western frontier cabins, dating from 1879 to 1901. The opera house has western shows (www.nezperce.com/tritown).

Be sure to see the Irma Hotel, which was built in 1902 by Buffalo Bill and named for his daughter. It is said the bar was a gift from Queen Victoria (www.irmahotel.com).

Every night the Cody Rodeo is presented with lots of fast paced events (www.codystampederodeo.com).

While in Cody, there is bus service (COLT) that runs between lodging, shops, restaurants, and attractions. There is a

charge of \$2/day or \$5 for a family for unlimited use. Hours of operation are 9 am to 5:42 pm and buses are wheel chair accessible (www.codywyomingnet.com/transportation).

The elevation of Cody is 5,095 feet, almost a mile high. The summers can be warm during the days, but rarely over 90 degrees. The evenings can be fairly cool, so a sweater or light jacket is suggested.

As long as you are in the area, you might also schedule a side trip to Yellowstone park (www.yellowstone.com) or to the former lodge of Buffalo Bill, Pahaska Tepee, (www.pahaska.com). Eighty-three miles southeast is Thermopolis, where there are hot springs for swimming, a dinosaur dig site, and an historical museum. (www.thermopolis.com).

Other websites for learning about Cody include the Chamber of Commerce (www.codychamber.org), the newspaper (www.codyenterprise.com), and websites www.codywyomingnet.com and www.yellowstonecountry.org.

ASSOCIATION NEEDS YOUR HELP

voluntary dues payment annually to cover the expenses of publishing the newsletter, maintain the website, and pay bills for postage and maintenance and expansion of the family genealogical database. If you haven't paid your dues in the past, I hope you will consider what a valuable association and family you are part of and begin sending dues each year. When you pay your dues, you will receive a member card and, if we have your email, the treasurer will send you a receipt for your payment. Jay was also an important and influential member of the Cody Family Association. He was the president of the Upper Canada Circle for many years and regularly was in attendance at the International reunions.
