Buffalo Bill Historical Center Wins Another Award

The Buffalo Bill Historical Center has been honored as one of America's "favorite museums for group travelers" by the National Tour Association. It won the Bronze Award in this category, tied with another prestigious museum: New York's American Museum of Natural History, The Gold winner was the Smithsonian Institution and the Silver went to the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York.



Bruce Eldredge, executive director and CEO of the Center, stated, "We definitely have cause to celebrate at being included in the distinguished company of the Smithsonian, MOMA, and the American Museum of Natural History. Our numbers of group tours have increased significantly in the last few years, and we couldn't be more thrilled with this prestigious award. This honor acknowledges how engaging our group travels find our galleries and is sure to draw even more attention and visitors to the Center and to Cody."

The ICFA is acting to reduce costs and increase participation. This year for the first time we are introducing an online 2012 Reunion Registration and Activities Sign-up webpage with PayPal and Shopping Cart buttons as another way (other than with paper) to take your reservations for the June reunion.

PayPal is a secure way to pay bills online. Payment can be made directly through your own PayPal account if you don't have one of the four major credit cards they accept. You can also pay your 2012 ICFA membership dues using the PayPal button on the webpage. Donations can also be sent to the ICFA at this time. What to Do if I Can't Make It for Reunion

If your vacation time prevents you from visiting Cody at the time of the reunion, don't think you won't find plenty to do if you go during a different part of the summer. There are always activities for all ages going on in the town. The Chamber of Commerce website, www.codychamber.org lists many things to do around the area.

Many other parts of the country have events and sites pertaining to Buffalo Bill. Check out some of the following:

A great statue of Buffalo Bill on horseback with a rifle in his hand aimed at a running bison is near Oakley, Kansas, just off I-70. The sculpture is close to life size and you can get a sense of how dangerous it was to try to bring down one of these mammoth animals while riding at full gallop. It was supposedly near here that Buffalo Bill participated in that great

bison shoot that earned him forever the nickname of Buffalo Bill.

Two other interesting sites are near here – the **Fick Fossil and History Museum** in Oakley, and a little farther down U.S. 83 south is the **Monument Rocks Natural Landscape**, filled with strange natural columns of hardened chalk, wind whipped into unusual shapes.

The **Buffalo Bill Museum and Grave** is located on Lookout Mountain near Golden, Colorado. Here Cody and his wife are both buried in graves covered by concrete, to forestall the rumor that some Wyoming citizens were plotting to steal his body and take it back to Cody, Wyoming. This very informative and pictorial museum is filled with photos, posters, and other exhibits of Buffalo Bill, his friends and family. The museum, grave site, and gift shop sit atop the mountain, up a wind-

ing paved road with great views.

The **Scouts Rest Ranch**, near North Platte, Nebraska, was home to Buffalo Bill in his later years. His famous Wild West Show rehearsed there. It is currently a state historical site that can be visited, providing that the North Platte River isn't at flood stage.

Buffalo Gals Luncheon

The BBHC will hold a Buffalo Gals Luncheon on May 15. Dr. John Rumm will present a program entitled Backstage with Annie Oakley. This heroine of the Wild West Show comes alive through intimate stories. Limited seating is available, so if you are going to be in the area, this would be a great event. My Relationship with Buffalo Bill

As children we learned our family history and stories from my grandmother, Mary Wheeler Hunt. It wasn't long before I began to feel important and proud. I found out that I was related to the great Buffalo Bill Cody—a cousin five times removed.

The Cody Association had started a numbering system to keep the generations organized and traceable. Each person was assigned a number according to the previous generations and including that person's birth order within a family. My grandmother's number is 117/113. The last #3 is my grandmother Mary. My mother's number is 117/1135, and my number is 117/11351. The natural conclusion to me as a child was that the lower number, the more important the person! Being a #1—and related to Buffalo Bill—made me feel proud. I began to "put on airs" around my school mates and look down on them because they weren't related to anyone

famous. I could make myself important, so important that I didn't need to be friends with anyone less important.

After a while my mother started to notice a change in my behavior, and it was not for the better. She told me about the less famous characteristics of my famous cousin. Buffalo Bill was made to be a living human being with faults and bad habits like anyone else. I learned a valuable lesson in that while you may have a famous relative, you do not have the right to claim that fame or notoriety. You have to make your own mark on the world and experience both the ups and downs.

After writing this, I was given the biography, **Buffalo Bill: The Man Behind the Legend**, by Robert Carter. This excellent book put to rest all the negative things that had been said in my family. Currently the book is being passed around in the family. I'm proud to be a descendant, but it is a different kind of pride now.

Target Card Featured

Famed photographer, Annie Leibovitz, has included in her new book, Annie Leibovitz: Pilgrimage, a photo of a target card used by Annie Oakley. Held in a private collection at the time Leibovitz photographed it, the card has since been bequeathed to the Historical Center. It will be on display in the renovated Buffalo Bill gallery when it opens in May.
