Our Cody *Review* newsletter, launched by Aldus Cody in 1962, has a long history of reporting the activities of the ICFA. For decades, subscribers have enjoyed articles about our Reunions, Circles, news with colorful vignettes of Buffalo Bill and family history.

Now one of our most cherished ambitions has been realized; We bring you access to the archives of *Review* back issues as presented by the Buffalo Bill Center of the West in cooperation with the ICFA!

We supplied over 500 pages of back issues, provided by our Editor Allan Cody, Ex-CEO Terry and Past President Gerald Cody, and there at McCracken Reasearch Library, under the direction of Mary Robinson, BBCoW Archivist Samantha Harper scanned, compiled and posted .pdf files of each issue on-line as part of BBCoW's Digital Collections.



















Buffalo Bill Legacy Gallery Makeover & Expansion!

On Sunday February 25th, members of the Florida Cody Family met for a wonderful dinner and family gathering at Cody Villa overlooking Crooked Lake in Babson Park, Florida in celebration of Buffalo Bill's birthday and the restoration of our Florida Circle. After singing "Happy Birthday" and reminiscing about the 2017 Reunion in Golden Colorado, the discussion turned to the future of the ICFA Florida Circle.

Polk Co. Citrus Label Tour!

The 100th anniversary of Frostproof's incorporation will be celebrated this coming Labor Day with a Citrus Label Tour. The citrus crop brought the railroad and built the town, for three years in the 1920s, Frostproof's depot shipped more Florida citrus than any other and each crate carried a distinctive brand label signifying the grade of its contents. In recognition, the Florida Citrus Hall of Fame, Visit Central Florida and the Polk History Center have partnered to promote a Citrus Label Tour of Polk County where participating towns will display banners from the downtown area's streetlight poles showing the local growers and packers' family names with their citrus crate labels.

Lindus and Amelia Cody were important pioneers in Frostproof citrus. Their son Arthur and his wife, Marie, owned Fruitainer there in the '20s and a grandson, William Judson Cody, ran the Producers Citrus Corp. The Review's Founding Editor, Aldus Cody and his brother Bob, both grew up in Frostproof where his mother, Josephine, taught school. Buffalo Bill visited his cousins Lindus and Luther in Frostproof.

From Oneida County, they took the Seneca Turnpike, the Lake Shore Trail, the Corduroy Road and the Old Sauk Trail.

Jay Lamdin 203/46121, presented us with his uncle Frank's 5page 1989 essay, "The Moore & Cody Families", telling of our Martha Cody 203 who together with her husband, Horace Moore, emigrated to Big Grove in LaSalle County Illinois in 1835. The story comes down to us through Horace's travelling diary, the log of their little party's journey from their home in New York's Oneida County to settle on the prairies of Illinois.

The Moore and Cody families had come to Oneida County from Union Connecticut, where they had met before the Revolution and intermarried.

Fascinated by the tale, we further researched the history of the area to determine the circumstances of their trek and the motivations and expectations for their move. Big Grove was a frontier settlement between the fur trader's outpost at Ottawa and the American Fur Company at Fort Dearborn, near the growing town of Chicago. LeClaire Buffalo Bill Museum Plans Addition!

The Buffalo Bill Museum in LeClaire, Iowa is excited to announce a new addition that will house a replica interior of a one-room schoolhouse.

From the 1850's to the 1950's, Iowa's one-room schoolhouses were thriving, especially during the 1910's and 20's. Most of the one-room schools in Iowa closed in the mid-to-late 1950's. The display will be a wonderful educational tool for the museum, showing visitors how education has evolved.

This exhibit focuses on the 1920's and contains authentic artifacts and encourages visitors to interact with objects found in the educational techniques of that time. Clapping erasers or chopping wood gets you extra credit!

Most Iowa one-room school houses ran similar to each other. Typically there wasn't any way for students to get to and from school, so they walked about 2 to 5 miles each day.

The school year was shorter than the 180 days we're used to now, because children were expected to help out during busy farming seasons, especially harvest time. A typical day would start around 9 am and could get out as early as 2 pm, depending on what time of the year it was. The length and number of days were not enforced as strictly as they are now.

Classes were composed of children ranging in age from kindergarten to 8th grade, with one teacher to educate and manage them all. Older children helped teach the younger children, key to making the classroom run smoothly. It seems that they responded to the land sales held to finance the I&M Canal, between Chicago and Ottawa and joined other Oneida County emigrants already residing at Big Grove. They remembered the positive impact the opening of the Erie Canal made on Oneida County and hoped the I & M canal would do likewise for LaSalle County.

Horace and Martha were not fur traders, but farmers and recognized the potential a new canal would unlock. They soon began cultivation of the rich prairie land just east of Big Grove and pioneered the town of Lisbon. They were joined by Horace's brother Jarvis and his wife, our Lydia 181, as well as several later arrivals from Oneida County, including their former pastor, Calvin Bushnell.

The accompanying plat maps of the 1870s bear witness to the settler's success and we find Horace, Jarvis and their posterity occupying large parcels in and around Lisbon.

The "4 Rs", plus history, grammar, rhetoric, and geography were commonly taught. Graduation depended on a Final Exam and only a few went on to secondary education.
